



Last Golden Ticket is a four-year-old gelding from an excellent family. This son of Sholokhov (sire of Cheltenham Gold Cup winner Don Cossack), won his sole start in a bumper (National Hunt Flat race) at Sligo in Ireland in July this year, showing a great attitude. Last Golden Ticket is a half-brother to Golden Chieftain (Grade 3 Cheltenham Festival winner) and Boychuk (Grade 2 novice hurdle and chase winner). With a bumper win behind him, it is likely that Last Golden Ticket will run in novice hurdles this season, with chasing an option further down the line.

Last Golden Ticket is to be trained by Donald McCain from his highly successful yard in Cheshire. Donald took over the reins at Bankhouse Stables from his father, Ginger, in 2006, and has trained a huge number of high-profile winners, including Grand National hero, Ballabriggs; Supreme Novice Hurdle winner, Cinders And Ashes; and dual Grade 1 winner, Peddlers Cross.
